Anton Kuerti has performed in recital and with leading orchestras in 40 countries. In Canada he has appeared in 140 communities, and played with every professional orchestra, including 39 concerts with the Toronto Symphony.

Kuerti has recorded all the Beethoven concertos and sonatas, the Brahms and Schumann concertos, and all the Schubert sonatas, among many other releases. A critic for 'Fanfare' wrote simply that "Kuerti is the best pianist currently playing"; CD Review (London) called him "one of the truly great pianists of this century"; Fono Forum wrote "Anton Kuerti is one of the greatest pianists of our time", while Gramophone called him "one of the leading Schumann pianists of our time".

Kuerti won the prestigious Leventritt Award when he was still a student. Other awards and honours include Officer of the Order of Canada, the Banff Centre National Arts Award, the Schumann Prize of the Schumann Gesellschaft, and the Governor General's Lifetime Artistic Achievement Award.



The Jacques Thibaud String Trio was founded at the Berlin School of Arts in 1994 and after winning First Prize in the prestigious Bonn Chamber Music Competition. toured extensively throughout Europe, the υ .s. and Canada. Most recently, in

2009, the Trio were featured guests artists at MusicFest Vancouver.


With their chosen name, the Trio pays homage to the great French violinist Jacques Thibaud (1880–1953), who along with his partners Pablo Casals and Alfred Cortot devoted much of his career to unearthing and performing the great repertoire for String Trio

Canadian born Violinist Kai Gleusteen divides his time between Paris, Prague, and Barcelona, and is widely recognized for his role as guest concertmaster of numerous European symphony and opera orchestras including Bordeaux, Lyon, Barcelona and Granada. He also served as guest concertmaster for the Houston Symphony in the USA.

The newest member of the Jacques Thibuaud Trio, Paul Cortese is currently Professor of viola and chamber music at both the Barcelona and Madrid conservatories. Mr. Cortese has been a member of the Beethoven Klavier Quartett, and is a well known figure at the international music festivals of Tanglewood, Banff, and Grand Teton. As soloist, he has performed extensively in Canada and the USA, including guest appearances with the Philadelphia and the Boston Symphonies.

A founding member of the Jacques Thibaud Trio , Rumanian born 'cellist Bogdan Jianu, has been a member of Radio Chamber Orchestra Bucharest, the German Symphonic Orchestra and the renowned Kammerphilharmonie in Berlin. As chamber musician he has collaborated with such artists as Anton Kuerti, Eugenia Zukerman, Laszlo Varga, Jane Coop, and Menahem Pressler.

Hermann Goetz

Quartet in E major for piano and strings, Op 6

Hermann Gustav Goetz (1840–1876) is yet another one of those remarkable composers who died so young, that his full potential was never realized. By the time of his death from tuberculosis at the age of 36 [out of the niceties of the age, it was publicly attributed to "overwork"] he had created a symphony, two piano concertos, a violin concerto, a piano trio, piano quartet, piano quintet, sonata for piano four-hands, much solo piano music and a comic opera, based on *The Taming of the Shrew*.

The piano quartet was written in 1867 and is dedicated to his friend Johannes Brahms who publicly admired Goetz' music, A more recent praise of his work came from the distinguished American music critic Laurence Vittes who wrote "Hermann Goetz's Piano Quartet is one of the masterpieces of the literature and it is sad to see it disappear from the repertoire."

Goetz first studied theology and mathematics in Konigsberg where he was born. But neither vocation matched the significance of music in his life, and he moved to Berlin where he studied with the celebrated conductor, composer and pianist Hans von Bulow.

In 1863 he was appointed organist at the church in Winterthur, Switzerland where he remained for most of his life, composing, teaching and writing reviews for various music magazines of the day.

Gustav Mahler performed some of Goetz' works towards the end of the 19th century; but for the most part his music was sadly neglected throughout his lifetime and for most of the 20th century. Only since the 1990s has his name begun to re-appear on concert programmes.


message from the president
