French-Canadian pianist Louis Lortie has attracted critical acclaim throughout Europe, Asia, and the United States. He has extended his interpretative voice across a broad range of repertoire rather than choosing to specialize in one particular style. The London Times, describing his playing as "ever immaculate, ever imaginative", has identified the artist's "combination of total spontaneity and meditated ripeness that only great pianists have".

Louis Lortie celebrated the bicentenary of Liszt's birth in 2011 by performing the complete Années de pèlerinage at international music capitals and festivals, and he returns to Carnegie Hall in 2014 to perform it there. His Chandos recording of this monumental work was named one of the ten best of 2012 by the New Yorker magazine.

Louis Lortie studied in Montreal with Yvonne Hubert (a pupil of the legendary Alfred Cortot), in Vienna with Beethoven specialist Dieter Weber, and subsequently with Schnabel disciple Leon Fleisher. He made his debut with the Montreal Symphony at the age of 13; three years later, his first appearance with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra led to an historic tour of the People's Republic of China and Japan. In 1984, he won First Prize in the Busoni Competition and was also prizewinner at the Leeds Competition. In 1992, he was named Officer of the Order of Canada, and received both the Order of Quebec and an honorary doctorate from Université Laval. He has lived in Berlin since 1997 and also has homes in Canada and Italy.

As for the past nine seasons, I expect that we will be sold out again for 14-15. Credit for this success has to go to a superb Board of Directors and an incredibly loyal membership.



Waltzes - Op. 34 and Op. 70


Among the best-loved of Chopin's works, the waltzes were intended for concert performance rather than dancing. Although Chopin most likely composed up to 17 waltzes, only 8 were approved by the composer for publication. The three Op.34 waltzes were published in 1839 but the Op.70 waltzes (written in 1830) were set aside by Chopin and only published posthumously in 1855. The elegance of Chopin's writing transports us to the aristocratic world of the ballroom.

Ballades - Op. 38 and Op.52

Chopin is credited with the invention of the ballade (or story) as a musical form. The works were inspired by Romantic poetic ideals, but unlike his contemporaries, Chopin disliked using descriptive titles for his works. His complete mastery of musical narration draws the listener into the story and makes the Ballades 'gems' of the repertoire.

Liszt's transcriptions of Wagner

Liszt was probably most famous as a concert pianist in his lifetime, but he was also an innovative composer. He wrote paraphrases and transcriptions of large-scale vocal and orchestral works and performed them on the piano. In order to overcome the piano's flaw - its inability to increase the sound of a note after it is played - he used tremolo and repeated chords most skillfully. His transcriptions of the operas of Wagner require great virtuosity and remain as some of his finest works.
