Borealis String Quartet

Since their formation in 2000 the Borealis Quartet has appeared for major chamber music series in New York, Washington, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Rome, Mainz, Shanghai, Taipei, Beijing, Toronto, Montreal, Ottawa and, of course, in their home town of Vancouver. Now they include White Rock. Their most recent season included a complete Beethoven cycle at the Metropolitan Museum in New York, as well as an


appearance on Canada Day on Parliament Hill for an audience of over 75,000. Currently they are Artists in Residence at Kwantlen Univerity in Langley. Members of the Borealis perform on a quartet of rare Italian instruments on generous loan from the CHIMEI Culture Foundation of Taiwan.



St. Petersburg Quartet

Once again, the St. Petersburg Quartet have reasserted their pre-eminence in the international chamber music world with an opening night performance at Mostly Mozart at Lincoln Center, a five-year residency at the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, a performance at Carnegie Hall, a six-concert series at New York City's popular BargeMusic Series, three concerts at the Los Angeles Music Guild as well as major tours of England

and France. Founded in 1985 as the Leningrad String Quartet, the Quartet has earned 1st Prize at String Quartet Competitions in Moscow, Florence, Tokyo and Melbourne. In 2010 the St. Petersburg Quartet was appointed the inaugural Quartet in Residence at the State University of Wichita, Kansas. They have recorded the complete chamber music works of Tchaikovsky.

Antonin Dvořák [1841-1904]

AMERICAN QUARTET, #12 OP. 96

Allegro ma non troppo - Lento - Molto Vivace - Vivace ma non troppo

The Borealis Quartet

The American Quartet was written in 1893 shortly after the New World Symphony. Dvořák was in the farming community of Spillville, Iowa home of a large Czech community, on vacation from his post as Director of the National Conservatory in New York. He wrote the work in sixteen days, finishing the score with the comment "I wanted to write something for once that was very melodious and straightforward, and dear Papa Haydn kept appearing before my eyes"

Dmitri Shostakovitch [1906-1975]

QUARTET # 8 IN C MINOR, OP. 110

Largo - Allegro Molto - Allegretto - Largo - Largo

In a year when he was diagnosed with Lou Gehrig's disease, and also reluctantly compelled to join the Communist party, Shostakovich dedicated the 8th quartet "to the victims of fascism and war". Whether this was Shostakovich's own tribute to all victims of totalitarianism, or whether the dedication was imposed by the Soviet authorities will never be certain, but the composer thought of the work as his epitaph and it was thought that he was even contemplating suicide around the same time. The work is built around Shostakovich's musical signature, DSCH. [In German, D, Eb, C and B natural]. These four notes appear in various forms in each movement.

Felix Mendlessohn [1841-1904]

OCTET IN E-FLAT MAJOR, OP.20

Allegro moderato ma con fuoco-Andante-Scherzo-Presto

The St. Petersburg and the Borealis Quartets

This remarkable octet for double string quartet was written in 1825, when the composer was only 16 years old. Alternately symphonic and intimate, the piece begins with a graceful allegro, followed by a gentle second movement. The mysterious third-movement scherzo [according to the composer's sister Fanny Mendelssohn,] evokes a ghostly vision from the pages of Goethe's Faust. The final movement contains a bustling fugue, not surprising, given Mendelssohn's extensive studies of Bach. Mendelssohn described he Octet as "my favourite of all my compositions" and added, "I had a most wonderful time in the writing of it!"


